1. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS







- If you do not use the handset for a long time, disconnect and remove the battery to prevent possible leakage.





6. PHONE SETTINGS

Your phone comes with a selection of settings that you can change to personalize your phone the way you like it to work.

You will need to set the correct time and date so that you know when you received answering machine (applicable to model with answering machine) or call list entries.

6.2.5 Set Alert Tones

A single beep is emitted when you press a key. You can turn on or off the key tone. You can also turn on the alert tones when low battery and out of range are detected. Low battery tone will be emitted while you are talking with the phone to alert you that you need to charge your battery. Out of range tone will be emitted when the handset is out of range from the base.

- 1. Press \Re /OK $\to A/V \to HS$ SETTINGS.
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → TONE SETUP.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow KEY TONE / BATTERY TONE / OUT OF RANGE.
- Press → /OK → ▲/▼ → ON / OFF.

- 3. Press \Re /OK $\rightarrow \blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow$ ON / OFF.
- Press →/OK.

6.3 Base Settings

6.3.1 Set the Dial Mode

The dial mode settings is country dependent. Please contact your local service provider for the correct settings.

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow BS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow DIAL MODE.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow TONE / PULSE.
- Press → /OK.

6.3.2 Set the Flash Time

The flash time settings is country dependent. Please contact your local service provider for the correct settings.

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow BS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \gg /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow FLASH TIME.
- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK $\rightarrow \triangle/\nabla \rightarrow SHORT / MEDIUM / LONG.$
- Press → /OK.

6.3.3 Change the System PIN Code

The default system PIN code is 0000.

- 1. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow BS SETTINGS.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow CHANGE PIN.
- Press ⇒/OK.
- Enter old PIN (Default: 0000).
- Press ⇒/OK → Enter new PIN again.

6.4 Reset Your Phone

You can reset your phone to the default settings. After reset, all settings and entries (except phonebook) will be deleted.

- Press ⇒/OK twice.

7. CALLER DISPLAY

7.1 Call List

This feature is available if you have subscribed to the Caller ID service from your local service provider telephone company.

- 3. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow ADD TO PB.
- 4. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow Enter name.
- 5. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow Edit number.
- 6. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ \rightarrow MELODY 1 MELODY 10.
- Press.

7.3 Delete an Entry in the Call List

- 1. Press ♣?.
- 2. $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown \rightarrow$ (a desired entry).
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → DELETE.

7.4 Delete All Call List Entries

- Press ^{♣?}
- Press ♦/OK → ▲/▼ → DELETE ALL.
- Press ⇒/OK twice.

7.5 View the Details of the Call List Entry

- Press ♣?.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow **DETAILS**.
- Press →/OK.

8. CALL BLOCKER

If you have subscribed to Calling Number Display (Caller ID) service, you can use the call block feature to automatically reject incoming calls without caller number display. These number types are those withheld number, and unavailable number.

You will not hear any ring tone from the blocked calls but they would be answered by answering machine (for answering machine model) all the time.

- Blocked calls are treated as new call log entries, the name of the call log will be replaced with Blocked call.
- Call block on is a local individual setting on each handset, you should turn on the feature on handset individual if you purchased more than one handset.

8.1 Block Calls Without Number Display in the Call List

- 1. Press $\frac{1}{2}$ /OK $\rightarrow \mathbb{A}/\mathbb{V} \rightarrow \mathbb{C}ALL$ BLOCK.
- 2. Press \Rightarrow /OK \rightarrow \blacktriangle/Ψ \rightarrow ON / OFF.
 - When On is chosen, press ▼ or ▲ to scroll to Private (for calls that the caller is blocking the telephone number), Unavailable (for calls that the caller's number is unavailable), or Both.
- Press →/OK.

9. TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Solutions		
My telephone does not work at all.	Make sure the batteries are installed and charged correctly. For optimum daily performance, return the handset to the telephone base after use.		
	 Remove and reinstall the batteries, then charge for up to 16 hours. If the problem isn't solved, purchase new batteries. 		
	Make sure the power adapter is securely plugged into an outlet not controlled by a wall switch.		
	Make sure the telephone line cord is plugged firmly into the telephone base and the telephone wall jack.		
Common cure for electronic equipment.	If the telephone is not responding normally, put the handset in the telephone base. If it does not respond, try the following (in the order listed):		
	Disconnect the power to the telephone base.		
	Disconnect the batteries on the handset.		
	 Wait a few minutes before connecting power to the telephone base. 		
	Re-install the batteries and place the handset in the telephone base.		
	Wait for the handset to synchronize with the telephone base. Allow up to one minute for this to take place.		

There is interference during a telephone conversation. My calls fade out when I am using the handset.

- The handset may be out of range. Move it closer to the telephone base.
- If you subscribe to high-speed Internet service (digital subscriber line - DSL) through your telephone line, you must install a DSL filter between the telephone base and the telephone wall jack.
 The filter prevents noise anda caller ID problems caused by DSL interference. Please contact your DSL service provider for more information about DSL filters.
- Appliances or other cordless telephones plugged into the same circuit as the telephone base can cause interference. Try moving the appliance or telephone base to another outlet.
- Other electronic products may cause interference to your cordless telephone. Install your telephone as far away as possible from the following electronic devices: wireless routers, radios, radio towers, pager towers, cellular telephones, digital telephones, intercoms, room monitors, televisions, VCRs, personal computers, kitchen appliances, and other cordless telephones.
- If your telephone is plugged in with a modem or a surge protector, plug the telephone (or modem/ surge protector) into a different location. If this doesn't solve the problem, re-locate your telephone or modem farther apart from each other, or use a different surge protector.
- The location of your telephone base can impact the performance of your cordless phone. For better reception, install the telephone base in a centralized location within your home or office, away from walls or other obstructions. In many environments, elevating the telephone base improves overall performance.
- Disconnect the telephone base from the telephone wall jack and plug in a corded telephone. If calls are still not clear, the problem is probably in the wiring or telephone service. Contact your telephone service provider (charges might apply).
- If the other telephones in your home are having the same problem, the problem is in the wiring or telephone service. Contact your telephone service provider (charges may apply).

Common cure for electronic equipment.

If the telephone is not responding normally, put the handset in the telephone base. If it does not respond, try the following (in the order listed):

- Disconnect the power to the telephone base.
- · Disconnect the batteries on the handset.
- Wait a few minutes before connecting power to the telephone base.
- Re-install the batteries and place the handset in the telephone base.
- Wait for the handset to synchronize with the telephone base. Allow up to one minute for this to take place.

This telephone is not equipped with a grounding function. Therefore, some of the functions may be limited when used in PBX systems. Please contact the technical support of the network provider for further information.
